Author of "The Wildest Province. SOE in the land of the Eagle" (2008), Edited and compiled "Forgotten Voices of the Secret War. An Inside History of Special Operations During the Second World War" (2008). Several journal and chapter contributions on the history of SOE.

Dr. Gorazd Bajc

Researcher at the Science and Research Centre of Koper, University of Primorska; Assistant professor at the Faculty of Humanities Koper, University of Primorska.
